# TOP TIPS FOR READING WITH YOUR CHILD

1. Read everyday – build a routine.
2. Talk about the plot and characters of a book with your child, encourage them to discuss this with you.
3. Try and provide different reading material for your child such as books, magazines, newspapers, leaflets etc. Particularly focus on newspaper headlines and relevant, interesting articles.
4. Discuss your ideas about the reading you have done and engage in a conversation about the reading afterward.
5. Encourage your child to guess unknown words and attempt to say words they do not think they can pronounce.
6. If possible, both you and your child could become members of your local library.
7. Provide a well-lit, comfortable area where reading can take place, if possible.
8. Try to make reading together an enjoyable activity, not a burden.

**Lunch** – pack your child with a lunch or ensure they have enough money on their ParentPay account.




# PUPIL PREMIUM



# WHAT WOULD YOU DO?

Imagine you are late to school in the morning due to a traffic disruption.

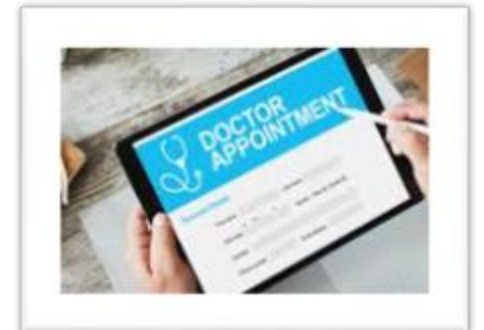
- What happens when you are late?
- What should you do when you arrive?
- If you arrive late:
  - **Before 9.00 am** - head to tutorial
  - **On assembly days before 9.00 am** – **Head to the Late Room**
  - **After 9.00 am** - sign in at reception, hand over your diary and get it stamped
  - **On Wednesdays** if you arrive **by 9.50 am**, head straight to tutor room, after 9.50 am - head to reception to sign in.
- At start of lunch time – **you must see your Head of Year/Deputy Head of Year to get your diary signed.**



# WHAT WOULD YOU DO?

If you are ill and do not come into school or need time off for a medical appointment.

- What should you do ?
- If you are ill:
  - Parents call before 8.30am to reception
  - On the day you come back – Bring a note/medical proof from your parent and take to your HOY
- Medical Appointment:
  - Parent to email school/or write a note with medical letter to HOY
  - Student will sign out/in at reception



# WHAT WOULD YOU DO?

Imagine you have been given a piece of homework that you don't understand how to complete.

- What could you do?
- What could you ask for help?



- As good practice, try and do your homework the night it is set.
- If you are struggling with the work set, see your subject teachers at lunch time (on days before the due date) and ask for help.
- If you struggle to complete your homework at home, please see HoY/DHoY to be added to HW Club
- Visit the learning support homework club at lunchtimes or afterschool

# ATTENDANCE

A whole year has 365 days  
A school year has only **190 Days**

This leaves:

**175 days** to spend on family time, visits, holidays, shopping, household jobs and other appointments

- 95% attendance = you miss 10 days per year
- **90% attendance = you miss 19 days per year**
- **85% attendance = you miss 29 days per year**

90% attendance is equivalent to 1 day off per fortnight
