Task 4 Textile Technique

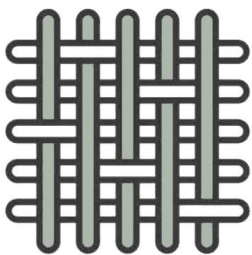
Weaving
