Task 2 Textiles Research

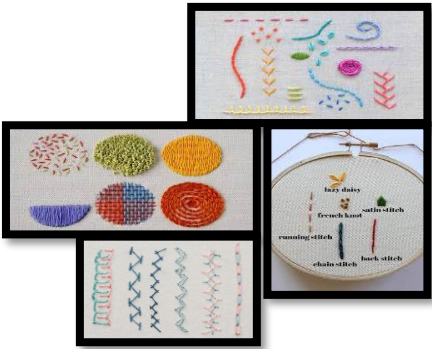
Hand embroidery

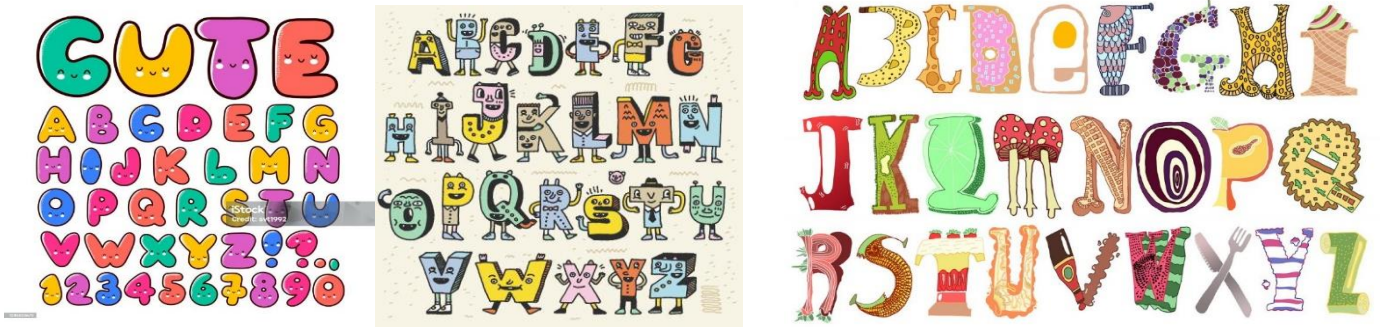
