

Dear Parents/Carers

General Information

There has been much speculation about when schools will return to normal operation and we are awaiting an announcement from the Prime Minister. It will not surprise you to learn that we have started detailed planning about what we will be able to accommodate, whether we are asked to open in June/July or after the summer. What is clear is that we will be unable to open to anywhere near capacity whilst we need to maintain physical distancing to prevent infection spreading. Further information will follow about this once government expectations are made clear in the coming days. This is going to be complex and is likely to remain so for a considerable amount of time whilst we work towards a new “normal”. Please bear with us while we work out the details.

As we stated in last week’s letter, we have taken the decision to cancel all trips and visits for the remainder of the academic year. There are a number of other school events which were scheduled to place in the next few weeks and which have also been cancelled:

- Year 7 Subject Evening
- Year 12 Subject Evening
- Year 7/8/9/10 Intervention Evening

Provision will continue in school all week. There will, however, be no expectation that learning will be provided, or indeed completed, on Friday 8th May which is nominally a Bank Holiday. We are encouraging staff and children to have a break for the day.

Home learning

We have had a good response from pupils submitting work to their teachers. Can we please ask for you to monitor your son / daughter’s work, to ensure that they are up to date. If there are any issues, which prevent your son / daughter completing their work, can we please ask for them to inform their teachers.

Form tutors are emailing their tutees every week to check on their progress. Please could you encourage your child(ren) to reply and maintain contact with their tutor.

Next Steps for pupils in Years 11 and 13

Following confirmation of the dates that results will be issued this year, we currently plan to hold admissions interviews for the Sixth Form from 10am on Friday 21st August. Please get this date in your diary. We will write to you again with a formal invitation later in the Summer term once we know more about when schools will be able to reopen.

A reminder:

- Thursday August 13th – A level/BTEC results issued
- Thursday 20 August – GCSE results issued

Schools have been told by the Department for Education and Ofqual that they must not discuss or share their centre assessment grades with students, parents or carers, under any circumstances, until after final results are issued. This is to protect the integrity of schools' judgements, and to avoid anyone feeling under pressure to submit a grade that is not supported by the evidence. Could I please ask that you respect this instruction and refrain from contacting teachers to ask about the process.

Trips, Visits and Work Experience

We have taken the decision to cancel all trips and visits for the remainder of the academic year. Even if lockdown ends and learners return to school, we feel the focus will need to be on re-establishing routines rather than being out of school and there is no guarantee that trips will be able to go ahead as planned anyway, particularly if social/physical distancing remains an expectation indefinitely. We will contact parents/carers about refunds when we have had the individual claims for each trip approved.

Free School Meals

We recognise that some families' circumstances will have changed because of the current crisis. If you think you may now be eligible to receive free schools meals but have not yet registered please apply via this link:

Arrangements for Learners who are not in School

Your son / daughter should aim to complete up to an hour of work per subject, each day. In total, no more than 4 hours. For example, 2 hours in the morning and 2 hours after lunch. In every year group, teaching staff will be available for pupils to ask any questions or to submit work for feedback, electronically. They can either take photos using their phone to submit or to scan work to be sent to individual teachers. Please ensure that pupils use their school email account.

Arrangements for Learners who are in School

If you are a key worker and your family circumstances change in the coming weeks, meaning you need to discuss accessing in-school provision for your child(ren), you should contact us by e-mail as outlined at the end of this letter. We want to help support our key worker families however we can during this challenging period, although the clear advice is that children should remain at home and attending school must be seen as a last resort if you have no alternative.
