

Dear Parents/Carers

General Information

You will be aware that the Prime Minister announced last week that the conditions had been met for schools to be able to re-open from Monday 1st June for children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 and he also confirmed that Year 10 and Year 12 should expect some “face to face” support from Monday 15th June. It is also clear from the announcements that Years 7, 8 and 9 will not be returning to school until September.

Our focus will be on ensuring the safety and well-being of our staff and pupils in this next phase and specifically on the re-engagement, and support for the young people who will be in school, despite what may look and feel like a different, sparse and sterile environment.

Return to In-School Provision for Year 10 and Year 12

There will be **no** face-to-face learning for Year 10 and Year 12 students in school until 15th June, following the Government announcement last weekend.

The school site has been prepared for Covid19-compliant health & safety arrangements with one-way systems and distance marking and we will only be inviting limited numbers of pupils into school at any one time. Pupils’ time in school will be focused on monitoring, guidance and support rather than class teaching and they will be working in small classes of no more than 10 pupils. We would be grateful if you could reinforce with your child how important it is for them to take responsibility for distancing on the way to and from school and in general when not in school so that our school does not become a place where infection spreads.

We will provide parents of pupils in Years 10 and 12 a detailed update of our plans by Thursday next week (11/06/2020).

Arrangements for Learners who are not in School

The emphasis this half term will be on supporting, reviewing and moving forward with home learning, other than for the daily provision for vulnerable learners and children of key workers who will continue to attend school.

We have had a good response from pupils submitting work to their teachers. Can we please ask you to continue to monitor your son / daughter’s work, to ensure that they are up to date. Pupils can submit work by taking photos of their work and emailing this to their class teacher for feedback. If there are any issues, which prevent your son / daughter completing their work, can we please ask for them to inform their teachers.

Your son / daughter should aim to complete up to an hour of work per subject, each day. In total, no more than 4 hours. For example, 2 hours in the morning and 2 hours after lunch. In

every year group, teaching staff will be available for pupils to ask any questions or to submit work for feedback, electronically. They can either take photos using their phone to submit or to scan work to be sent to individual teachers. Please ensure that pupils use their school email account.

Form tutors are emailing their tutees every week to check on their progress. Please could you encourage your child(ren) to reply and maintain contact with their tutor.

Next Steps for pupils in Years 11 and 13

Following confirmation of the dates that results will be issued this year, we currently plan to hold admissions interviews for the Sixth Form from 10am on Friday 21st August. Please get this date in your diary. We will write to you again with a formal invitation later in the Summer term once we know more about when schools will be able to reopen.

- Thursday August 13th – A level/BTEC results issued by email
- Thursday 20 August – GCSE results issued by email

Schools have been told by the Department for Education and Ofqual that they must not discuss or share their centre assessment grades with students, parents or carers, under any circumstances, until after final results are issued. This is to protect the integrity of schools' judgements, and to avoid anyone feeling under pressure to submit a grade that is not supported by the evidence. Could I please ask that you respect this instruction and refrain from contacting teachers to ask about the process.

Trips, Visits and Work Experience

We have taken the decision to cancel all trips and visits for the remainder of the academic year. We will contact parents/carers about refunds when we have had the individual claims for each trip approved.

Free School Meals

Supermarket vouchers will continue to be provided under the national scheme for the rest of the term. We do not yet know what the arrangements will be for the summer holidays but we will let you know as soon as we can.

We recognise that some families' circumstances will have changed because of the current crisis. If you think you may now be eligible to receive free schools meals but have not yet registered please apply via this link:

Arrangements for Learners who are in School

We want to help support our key worker families however we can during this challenging period, although the clear advice is that children should remain at home and attending school must be seen as a last resort if you have no alternative.
